[Are attitudes towards economic risk heritable? Analyses using Australian twin study of gambling](#)

Le, T. A., Miller, P. W., Slutske, W. S., & Martin, N. G. (2010).

This study employs multiple regression models based on DeFries and Fulker (1985), and a large sample of twins, to assess heritability in attitudes towards economic risk, and the extent to which this heritability differs between males and females. Consistent with Cesarini, Dawes, Johannesson, Lichtenstein and Wallace (2009), it is found that attitudes towards risk are moderately heritable, with about 20 percent of the variation in these attitudes across individuals being linked to genetic differences. While females are more risk averse than males, there is no

evidence that heritability in attitudes towards risk differs between males and females.
